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Dragi farani in prijatelji!

Lepe jaslice, ki smo jih lahko občudovali med božičnimi prazniki, je bilo treba po praznikih tudi pospraviti in počititi cerkev. To delo so opravili Robi Poredoš, Ana Grošelj in Branko Čampa. Vsem trem najlepša hvala.

Na januarski Kulturni uri nam je gospod Emil Gaspari v sliki in besedi predstavil legendarnega slovenskega športnika, telovadca **Leona Štuklja** (*12.11.1898 Novo mesto, +8.11.1999 Maribor). V telovadnem športu je prevladoval 14 let: od Svetovnega prvenstva 1922 v Ljubljani do Olimpijskih iger 1936 v Berlinu. V tem času je osvojil 17 medalj, od tega osem zlatih.

Na otvoritvi XXVI Olimpijskih iger 1996 v Atlanti je bil častni gost in najstarejši še živeči nosilec zlate olimpijske medalje; podelil je tudi medalje zmagoviti Ruski telovadni moški reprezentanci.

Leta 1997 je bil sprejet v Mednarodni Gimnastični Klub Slavnih.

1988 je prejel nagrado Olimpijskega Reda iz rok Predsednika Olimpijskega Komiteja J.A. Samarancha in tako postal častni član tega komiteja. Za to priliko je Samaranch uradno obiskal Slovenijo.

Gospod Emil Gaspari je ob Štukljevi 100-letnici leta 1998 organiziral njegov obisk New Yorka. V Empire State Buildingu se je dvigalo ustavilo v 100. nadstropju, kjer so ga presenetili s praznično torto, v Mohegan Lake je bil na otvoritvi telovadnice Dynamic Gymnastics, obiskal je West Point, ustavil se je tudi v naši cerkvi, in si jo z zanimanjem ogledal. Povzpel se je tudi na našo teraso, kjer smo ga pričakali s torto in mu zapeli Happy birthday. Ves čas obiska je bil dobre volje in z veseljem pokazal tudi kakšno telovadno vajo.

Na februarski Kulturni uri se nam je predstavil **Ciril Horjak**, alias Dr. Horowitz, ilustrator, stripar in likovni pedagog. Med drugim je avtor prvega slovenskega učbenika za strip. Je tisti človek, ki je "stripe iz trafike prestavil v fabrike".

V mednarodnem prostoru so bila njegova dela predstavljena pod pokroviteljstvom revije Stripburger. Njegove karikature so objavljali tudi tuji časniki, na primer britanski Guardian ali pariški Le Monde. Za Večerovo sobotno prilogo je ustvaril več kot tisoč podob. Prihaja z Raven na Koroškem, njegovi pglavitni lastnosti sta iskrivost in vztrajnost. V njegovem življenju so imele pomembno vlogo tete – tete z ozadjem, ne tete iz ozadja. Leta 2024 je na večer pred slovenskim kulturnim praznikom prejel nagrado Prešernovega sklada. (rtvslo.si)

March 19, 2025 - St. Joseph

Despite his humble work and means, Joseph came from a royal lineage. Luke and Matthew disagree some about the details of Joseph's genealogy but they both mark his descent from David, the greatest king of Israel (Matthew 1:1-16 and Luke 3:23-38). Indeed the angel who first tells Joseph about Jesus greets him as "son of David," a royal title used also for Jesus.

We know Joseph was a compassionate, caring man. When he discovered Mary was pregnant after they had been betrothed, he knew the child was not his but was as yet unaware that she was carrying the Son of God. He knew women accused of adultery could be stoned to death, so he resolved to send her away quietly to not expose her to shame or cruelty. However, when an angel came to Joseph in a dream and told him, 20 "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. 21 She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins," he did as the angel told him and took Mary as his wife. (Matthew 1:19-25).

When the angel came again to tell him that his family was in danger, he immediately left everything he owned, all his family and friends, and fled to a strange country with his young wife and the baby. He waited in Egypt without question until the angel told him it was safe to go back (Matthew 2:13-23).

We know Joseph loved Jesus. His one concern was for the safety of this child entrusted to him. Not only did he leave his home to protect Jesus, but upon his return settled in the obscure town of Nazareth out of fear for his life. When Jesus stayed in the Temple we are told Joseph (along with Mary) searched with great anxiety for three days for him (Luke 2:48). We also know that Joseph treated Jesus as his own son for over and over the people of Nazareth say of Jesus, "Is this not the son of Joseph?" (Luke 4:22)

We know Joseph respected God. He followed God's commands in handling the situation with Mary and going to Jerusalem to have Jesus circumcised and Mary purified after Jesus' birth. We are told that he took his family to Jerusalem every year for Passover, something that could not have been easy for a working man.

St. Joseph is the patron saint of the dying because, assuming he died before Jesus' public life, he died with Jesus and Mary close to him, the way we all would like to leave this earth.

Joseph is also patron saint of the Universal Church, families, fathers, expectant mothers (pregnant women), travelers, immigrants, house sellers and buyers, craftsmen, engineers, and working people in general.

We celebrate two feast days for Joseph: March 19 for Joseph the Husband of Mary and May 1 for Joseph the Worker. March 19 has been the most commonly celebrated feast day for Joseph, and it wasn't until 1955 that Pope Pius XII established the Feast of "St. Joseph the Worker" to be celebrated on May 1. This is also May Day (International Workers' Day) and believed to reflect Joseph's status as the patron of workers. (catholic.org)
